I will be accepting images now (a maximum of two from each photographer) and you can give them to me on disk directly or via e-mail at psparrow@cogeco.ca I MUST collect all the images by no later than Tues. March 9th.

Remember, I'm looking for your VERY BEST stuff as this is going to represent Latow half way around the world.
